



# SECRETARY'S REPORT

## 2022

With Derek, I attended the NCBA's EGM which was held to agree four areas and eight sub areas – each sub area with nine teams. Eight new teams joined the county league bringing the total number of teams to 65.

On 6<sup>th</sup> Nov. Derek and I attended the NCBA AGM. All the committee positions but one was filled. There were a number of changes to wording of play. In roving cot, the 'placing of the footer' will now read 'placing of the mat'.
